

CITY OF PORT MOODY

BYLAW NO. 2608

A bylaw to prevent littering and dumping in public places and posting or affixing any bill, notice, or advertisement on public property.

The Municipal Council of the City of Port Moody in open session assembled enacts as follows:

1. Title

This Bylaw may be cited for all purposes as "Litter and Dumping Prohibition Bylaw No. 2608".

2. Definitions

In this bylaw "public place" includes every road, square, lane, bridge, highway, park or other places which the public has access to as a right or by invitation, express or implied.

3. No person shall:

- (a) leave, scatter, dump or dispose of any garbage, paper, litter, glass or any other material either solid or liquid in any public place;
- (b) stamp, paint, post, affix or otherwise place or distribute any bill, poster, notice or advertisement on any public property without first having obtained written permission from the municipality;
- (c) expectorate in any public place;
- (d) deface, injure or damage any property or equipment owned by or in the care of the City of Port Moody in any public place.

4. Penalties

- (a) Every person, firm or corporation who violates any of the provisions of this Bylaw, or who causes, suffers or permits any act or thing to be done in contravention or in violation of any of the provisions of this Bylaw shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence against this Bylaw and shall be liable to the penalties hereby imposed.
- (b) Every person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this Bylaw shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of not more than two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00)
- (c) A separate offence shall be deemed to be committed on each day during on which a violation occurs or continues.

(d) Offences for which tickets can be issued and fines imposed are prescribed in the Municipal Ticket Information Utilization Bylaw.
